Indigenous claimants met 2 weeks ago. The Indigenous Land Use Agreement (ILUA) was passed.

Now in the hands of CABN (proponent)

Hopefully CABN abandon development due the moving of sites N + P.

CCA main issue now lies with how walkers will embark on the CGW.

Tracey Rose has been quoted stating “Bring them from Boreen Point”

Concerns raised regarding installing a Jetty or the use of a fast boat from Boreen Point or Noosa.
